160 Years of Craftsmanship

Our story began in 1832, when Georg Friedrich Heim started his trade as a comb maker in Ober-Ramstadt. In 1862, his son, Georg Heim Jr., established Germany's first comb-making factory. By 1900, with the support of his sons, the business had grown into the largest tortoiseshell processing factory in Europe. In the 1930s, production gradually shifted to acrylic glass – a new material that could be processed in the same way as tortoiseshell.

To this day, we carry forward our passion for design and precision craftsmanship, staying true to the values and vision of our founders.



Care

We have always placed great importance on form, material, and quality. Even today, our products are still handcrafted using traditional manufacturing methods and impress our customers with their beautifully shaped quality and sensuous surfaces.

Acrylic glass is dishwasher safe up to 50 degrees Celsius. However, we recommend cleaning our products by hand with lukewarm water and a mild detergent to preserve their beauty for years to come.
